CRABBING RESPONSIBLY AT BARNEGAT BAY

Catching blue crabs at Barnegat Bay is an important activity that spans generations. Over the years, there has been a debate about the numbers and sizes of crabs captured with perceptions that "crabbing isn't what it used to be". Learn about crabbing regulation, methods and the results of a derelict crab pot project that recovered crab pots throughout Barnegat Bay, NJ over a four year span.

Dr. Wnek will share the results of a survey conducted by The Marine Academy of Technology and Environmental Science (MATES) "Crabbing Responsibly at Barnegat Bay" (CRABB) Team that gained a better understanding of actual recreational crab captures and perceptions, including reported size requirements and blue crab capture practices. The program will be interactive and will provide ways to be more effective at practicing sustainable crabbing practices throughout the area.
