## **CRABBING RESPONSIBLY AT BARNEGAT BAY**

Catching blue crabs at Barnegat Bay is an important activity that spans generations. Over the years, there has been a debate about the numbers and sizes of crabs captured with perceptions that "crabbing isn't what it used to be". Learn about crabbing regulation, methods and the results of a derelict crab pot project that recovered crab pots throughout Barnegat Bay, NJ over a four year span.

Dr. Wnek wiill share the results of a survey conducted by The Marine Academy of Technology and Environmental Science (MATES) "Crabbing Responsibly at Barnegat Bay" (CRABB) Team that gained a better understanding of actual recreational crab captures and perceptions, including reported size requirements and blue crab capture practices. The program will be in-

teractive and will provide ways to be more effective at practicing sustainable crabbing practices throughout the area.
